Chairman's Note

SOLD OUT! The last tickets for "Calendar Girls" were grabbed in the first week of this month, making this (as far as we know) the first full length production to completely sell out in the society's history! Not only does it mean that it will be highly successful financially, it is also hugely gratifying for Brezetta and her cast. They, together with the stage crew, have been responsible for selling a vast amount of tickets — there are obviously a lot of friends and relatives who are keen to see some of the cast sporting little more than a smile and an item of domestic science. However, I am sure that the audience will remember the play more for its warm heart and the actors performances.

We have had presentations and auditions for the One Act Play evenings and for "Nunsense – the Mega Musical", both of which have now been cast with the exception of some minor roles in the musical. Rehearsals for these will start as soon as the play is over. We hope to be able to announce next year's Autumn play in the New Year, as well as an intriguing social event for next summer. "Fantastic evening...totally brilliant!" (Bourne Players), "...a very good evening" (Haslemere Players) – two very pleasing reviews of the Inter-Society Quiz Evening that we hosted in the Village Hall last month. This proved to be extremely successful in terms of the organisation, presentation and entertainment, but slightly less so in terms of our team's performance. Defending the title were Susie Dean, David Landau, Ian Page, Hilary Lee-Corbin, Laura Musco and myself. Having scored very highly for several rounds, and within a few points of the leader, we proved to be too slow in the charades round, a setback from which we couldn't recover and we finished fourth. Taking part were the Haslemere Players, Haslemere Thespians, the Bourne Players, Farnham Amateur Operatic Society, and the Midhurst Players. The winners were FAOS, narrowly beating the Midhurst Players, and were duly presented with the trophy. The Thespians have gallantly offered to host next year's quiz. Many thanks to Tony Legat and Richard White for compiling and presenting the quiz and to their other halves Heather and Mel for marking and scoring. Also to Pauline Harries, Jennifer Charters and Marian Walker for organising the food and running the bar, which made a useful profit.

At the AGM in September committee members Mary Coyte, Sara Rowe, John and Pauleen Dowsett stepped down and were replaced by Marian Walker, Hilary Lee-Corbin and Barbie Badger. As previously reported, Jim Hegarty also resigned as Treasurer, but has nobly continued to look after our accounts until after Calendar Girls is over. I am pleased to say that Stephen Penny will take over the reins again on a strictly temporary basis, but we are not letting up on our search for a permanent Treasurer. My grateful thanks to the retiring committee members for their service and support and particular thanks to Jim for his diligent accounting over the last two years.

Finally, our dear old scenery and wardrobe store ("the shed" - our principal asset) requires some structural work so the builders will hopefully be starting work shortly to carry out the necessary repairs.

We remember Peggy Blakeborough

You may recall we reported that long standing member Peggy died a year ago and an obituary would follow. Her daughter Jo has kindly provided the following summary of her long and active life.

Peggy was born in London in 1921. She and her family moved to Grayshott early in the war, just as a temporary measure, but liked it so much that they stayed. Peggy met, and in 1942 married, Ralph Blakeborough. Peggy became an early member of the Stagers, her first appearance in "Tony Draws a Horse" in 1954. She took part in many productions, often as a producer, and with Ralph sometimes helping to build scenery. Her production of "Doctor in the House", was the first to put the 'House Full' notices out. She served on the committee several times and was also a member of Grayshott Parish Council.

When Ralph became ill they moved to a smaller house in Haslemere, but she stayed with the Stagers. Peggy always enjoyed a good laugh but could be quite forthright, many may remember the "Top Hat Incident".

The "Top Hat Incident" arose when Peggy was directing "There Goes The Bride" in 1983. Needing a battered top hat for one of her cast, she dispatched someone to the shed to find one. They returned with the item, commenting that it didn't look battered enough. Peggy promptly grabbed it, punched her fist through the top and announced, "It does now!" Interestingly, her best remembered production is probably "Steel Magnolias" which in common with "Calendar Girls" involves a mainly female ensemble cast and a warm-hearted story revolving around the death of one of them.

As ill health and old age took their toll, Peggy was unable to participate or attend shows anymore, but she was delighted to have been made an honorary life member. Peggy died just a week after her 90th birthday.

I do hope everyone appreciates the decision to make this an all-female cast. This was something I had considered a while ago, but also realised that we should endeavour to make it all inclusive, and was looking forward to seeing which men came forward to audition.
